FINAL REPORT

The ENYGO Teach-The-Teachers workshop was organized in Rome, Italy, on the 28-29 of October 2014. This year it has been decided by ENYGO EEG to conduct this meeting with a program, which covers mostly clinical aspects. The chosen topic was «Complications in Gynaecological Oncology». The idea was to provide future gynaecological oncologists across the Europe with educational insight into the practical experience of senior colleagues. Clinically relevant problems in treatment of oncogynecological patients, such as side-effects and complications were highlighted.

Twenty-five colleagues from 13 countries have participated in this workshop.

During **Day 1** the workshop was conducted in manner of simultaneous discussions. This enabled participants to clarify the clinical situation and facilitated experience exchange.

Day 2 was devoted to educational aspects communicate with patients – i.e. who to convey information to patient in a comprehensive way. The workshop was also focused on importance of precise communication between colleagues and some other educational pedagogic aspects.

All attendees were provided with a list of address of all participants and all contents of the Workshop in PDF-format.

At the end of the meeting all the participants completed the evaluation form, which is a very important feedback for our educational events in the future. We always strive to design workshops which are of high interest and value for our young colleagues.

The social dinner provided opportunity to both faculty and attendees not only to taste Italian delicacies, but also to establish personal contacts for future cooperation.
