

# ENYGO REPORT

## Summary

---

The second ENYGO Workshop on Laparoscopic Surgery in Gynaecological Oncology was held at La Paz University Hospital in Madrid (Spain) from December 4 to 5, 2015. It was a very successful and interesting experience, which was attended by 20 trainees and 8 professors who worked with 10 surgical specimens.

The course focused on providing an in depth understanding of surgical anatomy, as well as hands on cadaveric advanced laparoscopic training for trainees in gynaecological oncology. It was exclusive as it used cadavers fixed with Thiel technique for imparting training. In addition to gaining knowledge and skills, attendees did get the opportunity to meet and interact with other colleagues and leaders in this field.

- On day 1**, participants acquired surgical skills on pelvic and para-aortic lymph node dissection.
- On day 2**, the program was focused on radical hysterectomy and laparoscopic suturing.


Senior and young professors assisted to the attendees during the surgical procedures in cadavers trying to explain and follow each step of their procedures

Assistants together with professors had also the opportunity to share the Madrid nightlife while enjoying the typical Flamenco show, interacting and making friendship and cooperation during it.

An interesting possibility would be to have one tutor demonstrating a procedure or steps on cadaver with audio visual transmission in the dissection room. The expenses would rise a little bit due to an additional cadaver, but it could improve the benefit for all attendees.

The combination of young doctors with very experienced professors was a great idea and gave a closer view of the procedures on cadavers.
