Recent ENYGO activities

ESGO Annual Meeting in Nice, October 2015

The new **ENYGO Executive Board** (EEG) was elected during ESGO 19, which was held in October 2015 in Nice. We parted with the previous leaders, Michael Halaska and Ignacio Zapardiel, who worked for ENYGO for four years, and with Elisabeth Chereau, who hosted us in Nice. their great work. We wish them much happiness and success in their future work within ESGO and in their personal lives and professional careers.

Rene Laky (Austria) was elected as the new president; Vladislav Sukhin (Ukraine), the vice-president; and new members Kamil Zalewski (Poland) and David Lindquist (Sweden) joined the existing team of Kristina Lindemann (Norway) and Polat Dursun (Turkey). The host of the next ESGO meeting in Vienna will be Stephan Polterauer (Austria). We will be happy to work for the benefit of the ENYGO community for the following two years.

The Fellows' Workshop was a unique event that gave us a chance to demonstrate twelve different medical schools' approach to laparoscopic pelvic lymphadenectomy and radical laparoscopic hysterectomy. • ENYGO Laparoscopic Surgery in Gynaecological Oncology Cadaveric Workshop, December 4-5, 2015, Madrid, Spain

A good knowledge of pelvic anatomy is essential to becoming a skilful gynaecological oncology surgeon, so it is essential that trainees acquire the ability to undertake advanced laparoscopic surgery, in order to provide the expected standard of care. The laparoscopic surgery workshop, organized by Ignacio Zapardiel and Dr Javier De Santiago in Madrid La Paz University Hospital, enabled participants to fulfil this goal and improve their skills during the hands-on sessions. In small groups, mentors (Denis Querleu, Arnim Bader, and others)



supervised and guided the participants, provided practical demonstrations, and corrected their surgical techniques.



• "Gestational Trophoblastic Disease & Teach-the-Teachers Workshop", February 5-6, 2016, Copenhagen, Denmark

This ENYGO workshop was organised by Mikkel Rosendahl, the national representative of Denmark, in cooperation with the EOTTD. The first day was an excellent overview of gestational trophoblastic disease, followed by a day of a "teach the teachers" workshop on recent ideas and concepts, about how skills should be taught and assessed. We hope that the participants now have a deeper understanding of GTD and are better mentors as well.
