**Goals accomplished :**

The goals what I would have liked to get, I got them totally. I had the opportunities to participate a lot of laparoscopic operations. I received a lot of new experiences during my staying at the hospital, such as the the preparation of vessels and ureters in the retroperitoneum. These were very new for me, as the laparoscopic way of the paraaortic lymphadenectomy and the laparoscopic pelvic lymphadenectomy. I got some new experiences (not closely connected to my aims, but I operate breast cancer patients too at my home insitute) about the primer reconstruction of the breast cancer. So I totally satisfied what I got here. I had the opportunity for reaching of my aims completely.

I involved a lot laparoscopic operations, which are shown me a new way of the surgical treatment of the gynecological cancer patients. According these techniques I got a new aspect of the surgical treatment.
